- INSPECTION CALL-IN REQUIREMENTS: The person performing the work authorized by the permit is responsible for notifying UDOT when work is ready for inspection. Every request for inspection must be called in at least 24-hours before the inspection is desired.
- Pothole Utilities we will require core to be removed, locate utility, Flow fill to bottom of pavement, Put core back in and utilibond in place.
- This agreement and/or permit is UDOT approval only. You are responsible to obtain clearances from rail roads, private propertyowners and local jurisdictions that you are working within.
- Any asphalt damaged by your work will require a mill and overlay of the entire effected area with UDOT approved HMA mix design asphalt, from an approved source.
- Licensee must do all work in accordance with UDOT standard drawings.
- Use current edition of UDOT standard drawing for traffic control. Use Utah MUTCD stardards for traffic control elements not shown in UDOT standard
- drawings. Traffic control must be posted at the encroachment site for entire encroachment period.
- Contact station foreman before starting project.
- Prior to any work within the right-of-way, a traffic control plan must be submitted to UDOT and reviewed by the UDOT Traffic Engineer.



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- Traffic Control Plans, signs and channelizing devices must conform to MUTCD Standards, as a minimum, and all signs must be equipped with three orange flags.
- This agreement and/or permit is UDOT approval only. You are responsible to obtain clearances from railroads, private property owners and local jurisdictions that you are working within.
- ANSI 107-2004 Class II clothing (or greater) is required of all workers within the right-of-way.
- Call 811, or contact Blue Stakes and check for other utilities in the area prior to excavation.
- No saw or pavement cuts permitted on this job.
- Licensee must place material such as road base, slag, gravel, etc. a minimum of 6" thick between edge of pavement and property line to prevent tracking onto the highway.
- ATSSA Certified Traffic Control Maintainer required.
- Licensee must comply with all environmental issues to include cultural & paleontologist clearances (see attachment "F").
- See Attachment "F".
- When a hazard is within the work clear zone and the vertical grade separation is 6" or greater or a slope steeper than 4:1, a UDOT approved barrier system is required.
- If paving is done after Oct. 15 and before Apr. 15, licensee must replace temporary repair work when temperature and weather conditions are such that asphalt pavement can be placed in accordance with state specifications. In all instances, cold mix must be replaced with hot mix.
- All work must comply with current ADA standards.
- Notify UDOT upon completion of project for inspection.
- An inspector may be required at permittee's expense, with 48 hours notice. By accepting this permit, I agree to pay for inspection fees.
- Licensee is responsible for repairing and/or restoring any portion of the roadway damaged during construction.
- Licensee must restore shoulder of highway to its original or better condition. Including reseeding, replacing sidewalk, fencing, pipe, culverts or signs removed or damaged during construction and any other roadway features.
- All work must be completed by 12:00 PM prior to any Holiday and shall not commence until 8:00 AM on the following work day.
- Licensee shall keep highway free of mud and debris. A sweeper broom must be accessible for cleaning purposes.
- The depth of bury for all utility facilities under pavement shall be a minimum of four (4) feet below the top of pavement or existing grade including open drainage features. Where utility facilities are installed within 20 feet from the edge of pavement, the depth of bury shall be a minimum of five (5) feet below top of grade so as to allow for installation of UDOT signs or delineators. Utility facilities under sidewalks shall be installed a minimum of three (3) feet below the top of sidewalk.
- Permit Holder will comply with all applicable environmental laws.
- Upon completion of project, contact the inspector as listed on this permit .
- A copy of the permit must be present at the encroachment site for the entire encroachment period.
- By the accepting this permit, the Applicant acknowledges the hazardous nature of the work and agrees to assume full responsibility in the event of an accident or other incident involving death or injury to members of the Permitess Group or others, or property damage that results from negligence or intentional conduct on the part of any member of the group.

Dear Permit Applicant:

Your requested use of State Highway right-of-way may be subject to various environmental laws.

The issuance of an encroachment permit by UDOT does not represent that you have complied with these environmental laws. See UDOT Standard Specification for Road and Bridge Construction 01355, 1.3-1.9 and all of Section 00820.

Particular laws you must comply with include:

- * water quality regulations dealing with storm water discharge and wetland protection
- * wetland disturbances
- water rights regulations
- * air quality, including fugitive dust emissions
- * encountered underground storage tanks or buried hazardous materials
- * protection of threatened and endangered species
- * historical, cultural and/or paleontological sites

This list is not all-inclusive. It is your obligation to see that those environmental laws are complied with just as you are to comply with all other laws and regulations related to your work. The fact that a UDOT inspector may review aspects of the work does not imply that you are in compliance with any other laws or regulations or absolve you from any duties related to the work or the permit.

If the location where the work is to be performed is situated within a highway easement through Federal Lands (BLM, Forest Service or other federal land ownership) or is owned by another state agency, you must also contact the appropriate agency to obtain clearances from them for the work you propose to perform.

ENVIRONMENTAL LAW ADMINISTRATORS (CONTINUIED)

YOU ARE REQUIRED TO FOLLOW THE BELOW PROCEDURES OUTLINED ON ALL EXCAVATION

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1. If a suspected hazardous materials, underground tanks, threatened or endangered species, historic, archeological or paleontological (fossil) item, feature or site is encountered, the construction operation of the permittee shall immediately stop in the vicinity of the discovery.

2. The UDOT region permits officer will be verbally notified by the permittee of the nature and exact location of the findings.

3. The UDOT region permits officer will keep the permittee informed concerning the status of the temporary restriction.

4. Failure to restrict construction and/or notify the UDOT region permits officer may result in revoking the permit and/or the conviction of a Class B Misdemeanor under UCA 9-8-404.
